**Home is Holy: Alleluia Chain**

Easter lasts for seven weeks! Help it last in your family by marking your Alleluia moments. Ask family members to write or draw an "Alleluia" of the day on a strip of paper. Explain that *alleluia* means "praise God." An "Alleluia" is anything that brings joy, such as a smile from a friend, a beautiful sunrise, an answered prayer, or even eating a favorite food. After each family member writes or draws his or her "Alleluia," use tape or a stapler to link the paper strips together to form a chain. Hang the chain someplace where everyone will see it each day. Continue this activity during the Easter season, watching it grow on the way to Pentecost.

New Students for Confirmation

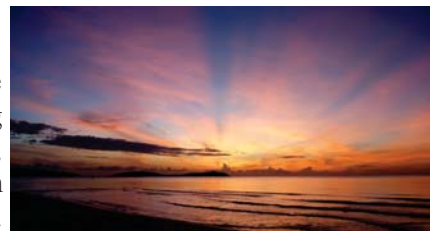
