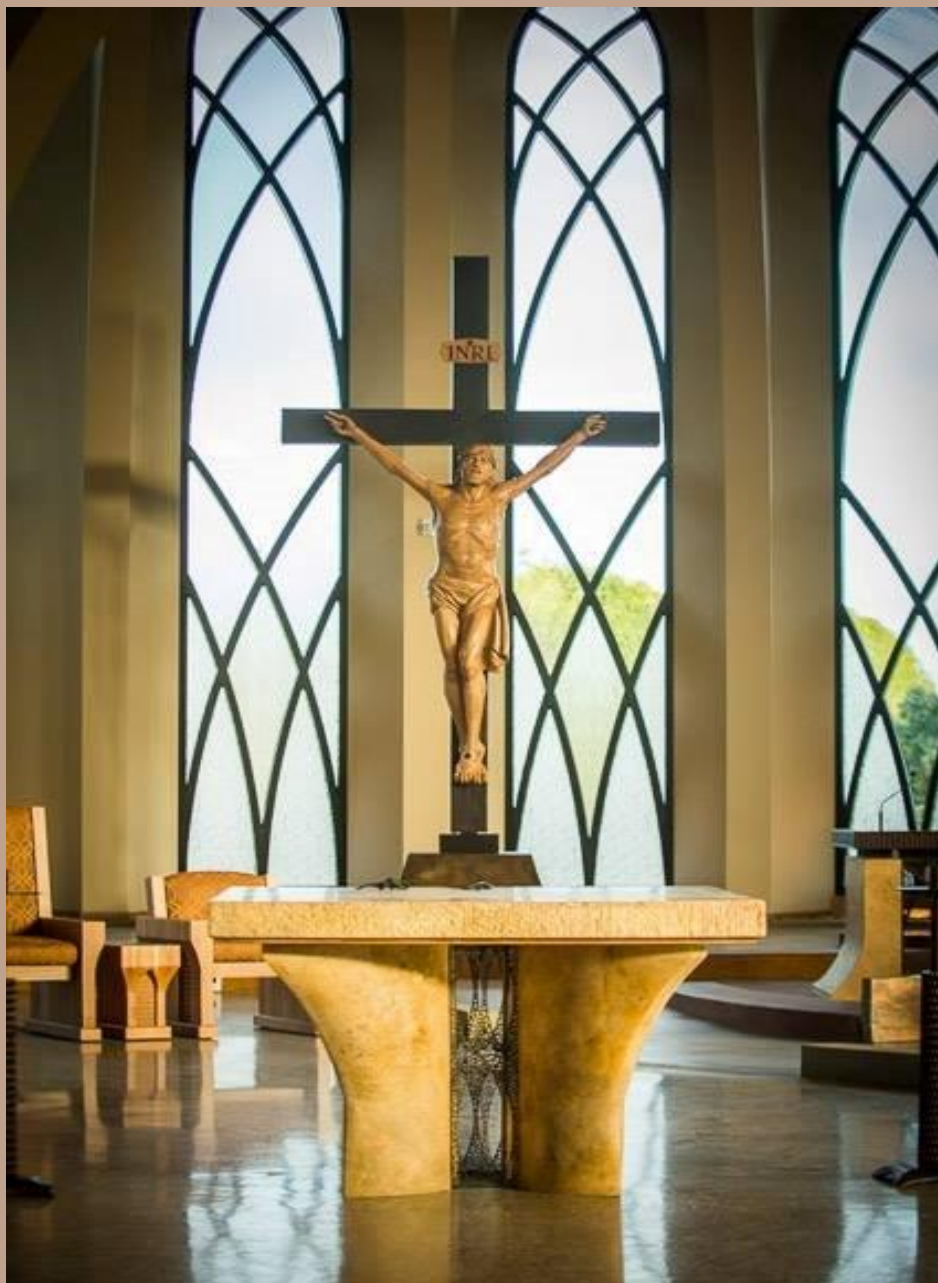

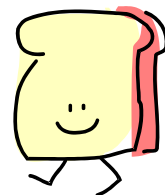


Home is Holy: A Halloween Prayer

Gospel Recap:

In Jesus' time, some Pharisees thought that Jews could stay close to God by following more than 600 religious rules. Each of these rules was considered equally important, and they covered everything from eating to bathing. In the Gospel this week, these Pharisees try to trap Jesus in an argument, by making him select the "greatest commandment." But Jesus doesn't fall into their trap. His answer challenges them to apply all rules showing allegiance to both God and their neighbors. This week think about how you treat others: Are you a team captain and do you show compassion to the players, or do you humiliate the newer members of the team? Do you babysit younger brothers and sisters and do you use your authority by overpowering them, or do you use your authority wisely? Do you lead a school club and treat your peers equally, or do you single out special friends from others? God wants us to show compassion and respect for others when we lead and go about enforcing rules, as he is compassionate with us.





St. John Fisher School Goes to Summer Camp



During the week of October 9th-13th, the St. John Fisher School 6th grade class attended Science Camp at the Pali Institute in Running Springs, CA. During their 5-day stay, the students took classes in areas such as: aerodynamics, team building, archery, reptiles and amphibians, crime scene investigation, experimentation processes, high ropes courses, astronomy, and more! In aerodynamics, students learned about Newton's laws and the Laws of Aerodynamics to help them design bottle rockets and measure the height to which they traveled using altitude calculators. In the CSI class, the 6th graders were given evidence to a crime and had to solve the mystery using fingerprints, blood typing, video surveillance footage, and handwriting analysis. A group favorite was the high ropes course—an obstacle course 40ft in the trees! Pali Institute was an incredible hands-on learning opportunity for our 6th grade class and a wonderful bonding experience for the group to grow in leadership, teamwork, and friendship.
