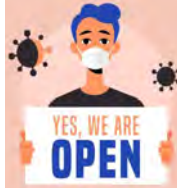

Home is Holy: Forgiveness

When someone hurts us, it's very common to want revenge. We often feel it's unfair if that person does not experience the same hurt inflicted on us. In the Gospel for this Sunday, Jesus tells us that his way is different. Instead of looking for ways to get back at someone, we should remember that Jesus always loves and forgave us. His whole life was given so that we might be forgiven and united with God. So, are we to forgive only once in a while? Jesus said there is no limit to the amount of times we should forgive others. Surely he didn't limit his forgiveness of us! Receiving forgiveness is a wonderful feeling, and giving forgiveness is equally wonderful. Is there someone you are mad at? Try forgiving that person in your heart. You will be astonished at how much better it will make you feel!

What will “home-school” Religious Education be like?

The coronavirus pandemic has changed many of the ways we do things, including Religious Education. This year we will be starting Religious Education with home-schooling. Children will receive student books, and parents will be given coaching on key points of the lessons with brief YouTube videos. 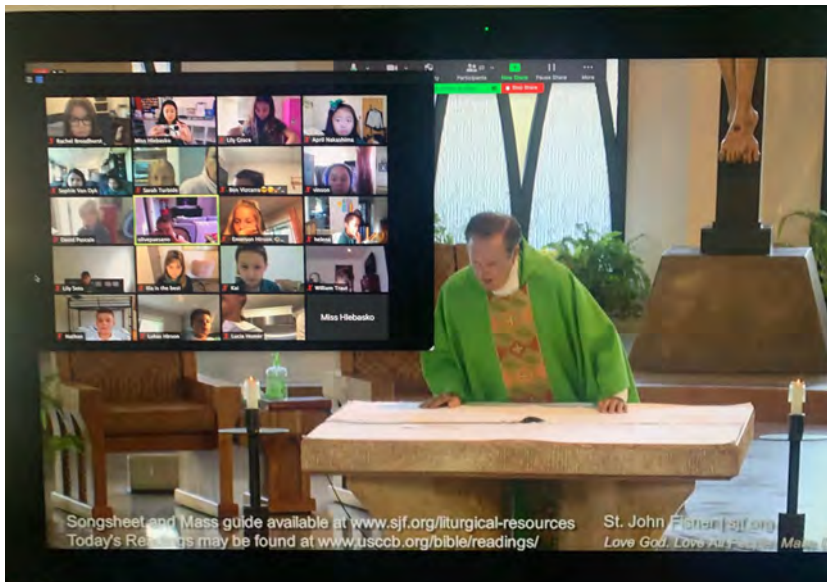




SJF School Students Attend Mass Virtually

In normal times, one way the classes at St. John Fisher School celebrate and nourish their faith is by attending morning Mass once a week as a class. Celebrating the sacrament as a group brings them closer to God and inspires them to carry God’s word into the world through their words and actions.

In challenging times like these, that need for spiritual nourishment is even more important, which is why SJF classes have begun continuing this tradition by attending morning Mass virtually once a week. On Wednesdays, the 3rd and 4th grades gather with their teachers via Zoom at 8 am and “tune in” to the livestream of the daily morning Mass. Parents are invited to join for this worship time together, and they listen to the Word of God, participate in the prayers and songs, and make that important connection to God and Jesus first thing in the morning. Maintaining this weekly ritual keeps the students in touch with their Catholic faith, and provides a much needed sense of spirituality and normalcy that helps guide them through these uncertain days.

Did you Know? Cyberbullying and distance learning

This year, with school starting online, children will be interacting with one another via technology even more than usual. Be on the lookout for signs that bullying is happening via the internet, texting, various apps, or social media. As challenging as it is, monitor the amount of time your children are “plugged in” and the content of what they are doing when interacting with their peers. Cyberbullying can include the use of apps, texts, photographs, and images that are intended to hurt, harass, embarrass, or even destroy the reputation of a victim. Unlike bullying at school, children cannot walk away from cyberbullying — it spreads instantly, 24/7. Children who are cyberbullied may avoid going online or talking to their so-called friends. They are likely to be sad or angry and may have low self-esteem.
