Home is Holy: Be prepared for God!

If you were going to run a marathon, what are some things you would have to do ahead of time? Do you think you would be prepared to run such a long distance if each day for a week before the race you only ran around the block and then took a nap? Do you think your feet would be able to carry you the whole distance if you only had flip-flops to wear? In the Gospel today, Jesus uses a story to help us understand how important it is to be ready to welcome God into our lives. We need to prepare in advance. If each day we try a little harder to follow Jesus' example of love, we will grow in holiness and can recognize that we see God in other people and in the world around us every day!

This week Jesus advises his followers to prepare themselves. The early Christians thought the world might end at any time. This Gospel challenged them to take an honest, prayerful look at how they were living. We aren't expecting the world to end soon, but we still need to prepare ourselves in the same way. We all make mistakes, and we all sin. If we look honestly at those times, repent, and learn from them, then our mistakes and sins can prepare us to help others. For example, have you made mistakes with alcohol or other drugs? Have you been gossiping or bullying someone? Have you been too judgmental or too materialistic? Repent now and learn from those mistakes, and let them prepare you to help others avoid them. This week look honestly at your mistakes. Don't be ashamed of them. Ask God to help you make them lamps that give others light for their lives.

Did you Know? How to help your children with anxiety

We're living in uncertain times, and our anxiety about what is happening today, and will happen in the future, can trickle down to our children, making them anxious too. This anxiety may manifest in new fears, for example when a child becomes reluctant to try new things, or it may exacerbate existing fears, when a child becomes even more anxious than previously. Parents can help their children with anxiety by practicing techniques for deep breathing, ensuring regular exercise and talking honestly about feelings and concerns.
