## Did you Know? Safely store and administer medications for children

During cold and flu season, many parents give their children a fever reducer, cough syrup, and other medications. These medications can help ease your children's symptoms, but if they're administered or stored improperly, they could put your children at risk. Children are far more susceptible than adults to the effects of medication, because their bodies are smaller and still developing. Even small amounts of drugs can be difficult for them to metabolize, so it's critical to follow your doctor's instructions and to closely monitor children who are old enough to administer their own medication. Make sure medications are stored properly, out of children's reach. ## Stewardship Reflection

*“Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you have been faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities.” Matthew 25:21*

God calls us to nurture and develop the gifts He has given us and then generously return a portion with increase. He doesn’t want us to waste or hoard the gifts He has given us. He expects us to grow our gifts, use them wisely and be generous with them. Unfortunately, many of us are not generous in proportion to all that God has given us.

## Living the Paschal Mysteries

Life in community can be a gift. We join others who share a common purpose. We combine efforts to achieve a common goal. But in these cases, much like “group work” assigned to school children, there can be freeloaders who live off the largesse of others’ efforts while contributing little to no effort of their own. The parable today reminds us that there will come a time when God will take stock of each person’s efforts. This is not our work to do, but God’s.



When we hear this parable and others like it, we can be moved to action, investing ourselves more fully in the Christian life. And for the Gospel of Matthew that means service of others, especially the less fortunate. May this gospel motivate us to continue serving without counting the cost, investing fully of ourselves and our talents. There will be an accounting, and when there is, we want to hear the words, “Come, share your master’s joy.”

## Called & Gifted

The Called & Gifted Discernment Process helps Catholics discern the presence of charisms in their lives.
