### Gospel Recap: God Doesn't Always Make Sense

Going back 2000 years, a teen girl listens to God's call. She lives in a culture where young women are viewed as men's property. She also lives in a region, Galilee, looked down by the rest of Israel. Yet God has chosen her to transform the world by bearing the baby Jesus. It made no sense--unless you know God. Mary must've known her Jewish scripture. She must've grown up learning that she could trust God's love, trust it enough to risk it, by agreeing to bear Jesus as an unwed mother. *You* can trust this God as well. You might think you can't make a difference. Trust God and risk a try. You might feel unlovable at times. Trust God and reach out for the special friends God *will put* in your life. You might think you can't stand up for a tough stance you know to be right. Trust God and feel his holy strength fill your soul. And like Mary, you can change the world.

## Celebrating the Season of Advent

Students at SJF are celebrating the season of Advent by using the *Pflaum Gospel Weeklies*, a program that is centered around the Sunday's gospel, in addition to their Religion textbook. Every week, the *Gospel Weeklies* introduce the Gospel theme and how it relates to Church teaching and doctrine in five different age groups. The magazine also highlights upcoming feast days.

Students in all grades are invited to engage in last discussions, games, and activities related to the upcoming liturgy. Sunday was *Gaudete* Sunday. Students learned through their Gospel Weekly that the Church calls this Sunday *Gaudete*, which means "Rejoice" in Latin and the liturgical color may be rose instead of purple to heighten our expectation as we draw nearer to Christmas.

In addition, each grade has a specific theme to focus on. The *Gospel Weekly* magazine for TK is called *Seeds*. The *Seeds* lesson this week will help the students relate to the people in Jesus' time who waited for him to come too. Kindergarten and First Grade study the magazine, *Promise*. The *Promise* lesson this week focuses on waiting with joy.

Second and Third graders utilize the *Good News* magazine. Their lesson explains the word Messiah and that Christ is a title that means the same thing as Messiah – anointed one.

The Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Grade students read the *Venture* magazine. The theme of the week is Jesus calls forth the best in us. The students will learn about the O Antiphons and why they are prayed during Advent.

The Seventh and Eighth Grade's Gospel Weekly is titled *Visions*. The theme for *Gaudete* Sunday centered around John the Baptist and how he prepares for Jesus. The O Antiphons are also explained.

The *Pflaum Gospel Weeklies* program provides a valuable supplement to our Religion curriculum that is engaging and informative throughout the Church's Liturgical year and our school year.

## Stewardship Reflection

*“Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you!” Luke 1:28*

After Jesus, we look to Mary as an ideal steward. Her entire life was lived in obedience to God’s call. Mary teaches us to live with joy for all we have been given. Just as the moon reflects the light of the sun, Mary reflects the light of Christ. Like Mary, we are called to reflect Christ’s light to the world through our gratitude and generosity.

## “Of His Kingdom there will be no end”



Throughout the gospels, Jesus preaches the imminence of the kingdom of God and calls for those “with ears to hear” to “repent and believe.” We could say the first person to hear of and draw near to this kingdom is Mary. Gabriel tells her that the child she will bear “will be called holy, the Son of God.” In Mary’s reliance and trust in God’s words, the kingdom takes root in her, just as it wishes to take root in each of us.

Despite the brevity of this Gospel the details provided of Jesus’ ministry are often more extensive than either Matthew or Luke. Mark provides a quickly moving narrative which stresses Jesus’ message about the good news of the kingdom of God and Jesus himself as the gospel of God. **GROWING IN THE WORD:  
MARK**

The shortest of all New Testament Gospels the Gospel of Mark is thought to be the first to have been written. Despite the brevity of this Gospel the details provided of Jesus ministry are often more extensive than either Matthew or Luke. Mark provides a quickly moving narrative which stresses Jesus' message about the good news of the kingdom of God and Jesus himself as the gospel of God. Together we will study the Gospel of Mark, using the Collegeville commentary edition along with the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Our journey through the Gospel of Mark will provide us an opportunity to experience the action and passion of the life and ministry of Jesus. Together we will be challenged, encouraged, and transformed by this first Gospel, written for "hard times" reminding Christians that all their sufferings were already endured by Jesus.
