

## **Face Coverings are Required**



Face coverings are required when visiting the parish office, for all outdoor Masses and when coming to receive communion for everyone over the age of 2. This is crucial in preventing the spread of COVID-19. They must cover the mouth and

nose at all times except when you place the Eucharist in your mouth. Please keep at least 6 feet distance from one another at all times.

## Did you Know? Talk to teens about posting photos

The pictures we share on Instagram and other social media can reveal much more information than just the picture we want our followers to see. If your teens are on social media, talk to them about the dangers of posting photos with potentially identifying information — posing in front of their schools or cars, tagging their location, or providing other clues that would give a predator easy access. Consider having a family screening contract, where parents approve photos before children can post. ## **Stewardship Reflection**

"...as the Lord has forgiven you, so you must forgive." Colossians 3:13

Forgiving is one of the hardest things for people to do. We can't give what we don't have. We need to receive God's mercy and forgiveness first before we can give it to others. Go to the sacrament of Reconciliation and receive God's mercy and forgiveness. Then, share the gift of forgiveness with someone, a family member, a friend or a co-worker. Pick up the phone or text someone right now.

## "My Eves have Seen your Salvation."

Within the simple family from Nazareth, Simeon recognizes the consolation and salvation he has been awaiting his entire life. We could ponder what it was about this child, these parents, that prompted Simeon to utter, "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace." Only through the power of the Holy Spirit is Simeon given eyes to perceive the light of the world enfleshed in the newborn Jesus. Christ is present in our daily lives as



well, in the people we meet inside and outside of our homes. Through the revelation of the Holy Spirit may we, too, be able to recognize him and serve him.

## Growing in the Word: Gospel of Mark



Despite the brevity of this Gospel the details provided of Jesus' ministry are often more extensive than either Matthew or Luke. Mark provides a quickly moving narrative which stresses Jesus' message about the good news of the king of God and Jesus himself as the gospel of God.
