Gospel Recap: "We're in Good Company"

If we get confused sometimes about what God wants, we're in good company. This week, three apostles join Jesus on a mountain where he is transformed, and they truly see who he is. They also hear God's voice, telling them to listen to Jesus. They go down the mountain still confused. Later they even abandon Jesus. The apostles were human, just like us. Wouldn't it be nice to hear God's voice and to see Jesus every day like they did? God, at times, can seem



so close, and at other times he seems distant. Some bible passages can seem clear, and others can seem confusing when we try to live them out in our daily life. Some of us have had mountain-top "transfiguration" experiences, at a retreat or through a powerful prayer during adoration. At these times, God can appear so close, but even our greatest saints have talked about how hard it can be to hold onto that clarity every day. So let's just follow the apostles' example when we get mixed signals. In times of confusion, the scriptures tell us that the apostles kept trying. They read scripture together, and they prayed together before making big decisions. Then they tried their best and trusted that the Holy Spirit would work through them. And in the end, they changed the world.

SJF K-6th Graders Returning to on Campus Learning

With Covid-19 cases decreasing in Los Angeles county St. John Fisher School has been cleared to welcome all students in grades K-6th grade back to campus full time! After almost a year of remote learning students and teachers are thrilled to be back together on our beautiful campus.

With this wonderful news has come a lot of planning. We have implemented staggered drop offs along with safety questions and temperature checks before students exit their cars. All children and adults on campus are required to wear a mask. Recess times have been adjusted to allow space for children to run and play, while staying safely distanced. Plastic barriers have been added to lunch tables allowing only three students per table. We have moved from a seven-period schedule to six periods to allow more time for hand washing and safe transitions.

Families who chose to continue with virtual learning are accommodated with Zoom links enabling children to log-on to "class" and watch lessons live with their classmates.

Another new component of on campus learning is a class called Community. In lieu of computer class in the lab, fourth to sixth grade students will learn about social emotional health, problem solving, and teambuilding. With so much time on screens in the last eleven months we are looking forward to bringing students safely together to get to know each other and build their class community.

Students in grades kindergarten to third grade returned to school on February 22nd, and will increase their school day to 8am-3pm beginning March 1. Fourth to sixth graders will begin back full time on March 4th
