

Announcing Campaign 21 -Completing the Vision

Some 16 years ago, our parish began a transformation for the 21st century with the creation of a campus master plan that would serve our community well into the future. Much of the master plan has been completed - our beautiful new Completing the Vision church, the transformation of our



previous church to a parish activity center for our youth, and the creation of a grass field for our school.

Lack of funding prevented us from completing the remainder of the plan. Now, the time has come to complete our journey. You can learn more about this project by viewing the Campaign video on our parish website, www.sjf.org.

Our success depends on raising \$8 million in pledges from members of the parish community. Of this amount, \$1.4 million will be directed to the Archdiocese's Called To Renew campaign for capital improvements at needy parishes.

Early commitments from a small number of generous donors have helped us exceed 75% of our goal (see below). We now call on all parishioners to join us in ensuring our success.



Gospel Recap: "It's Good to be Claimed"

Each of us has been claimed by God and God's love. This week's Gospel shows us how Jesus was realizing how God had proudly claimed him as His Son. If I, too, am claimed by God, God will always be close to strengthen and support me. God

will also show me a path toward a fulfilling life. Like God did with Jesus, God claimed us during our Baptism. Our Baptism, like Jesus' Baptism, shows our core identity. It makes us the children of God, the Creator of the Universe, and nothing can ever change that. Belonging to God can free you, too, if you let it. It can free you from having to impress friends or foes. It can free you to be yourself and to use your talents courageously to change the world. But some teens don't ever feel claimed by God or by anyone. They live lonely, painful lives. That's why God needs us to remind them that God loves them as his sons and daughters. We can do that by reaching out to the forgotten people in our society; by stopping people who put others down or minimize them, and by inviting people, who seem friendless, to join our circle of friends.

Ara Coeli Mass at St. John Fisher School

The Ara Coeli Mass has become a St. John Fisher School tradition put on every Christmas Eve during the 6 pm Mass by the second grade class. This Mass is named for an ancient church and shrine of the Blessed Virgin on the Capitoline Hill in Rome. On Christmas Eve, guests at Santa Maria of Ara Coeli climb one hundred twenty-four candle-lined steps and enter the church. At midnight, an olive wood statue of Baby Jesus covered in jewels is paraded from his private chapel to a ceremonial throne and finally to a Nativity Crib. Then the children of Rome approach the pulpit and offer prayers, recite poems, or make requests before the Santo Bambino. The students receive their readings and memorize them. In preparation, the class practices throughout the month of December. This year, we included third grade students as they were unable to participate last year. This years readers: Brianna, Chase, Chloe, Diana, Dylan, Kayden, Maya, Michael, Natalie, Nicole, and Solomon. Thank you to all the families for helping students memorize their readings and parishioners for joining us.

Did you know? Check your child's backpack

As you and your children prepare for their return to school after Christmas break, make sure they are not carrying too much around in their backpacks. Backpacks that are too heavy can cause problems like neck or back pain, or poor posture. The American Chiropractic Association (ACA) recommends that a child's backpack weigh no more than 5-10% of the child's body weight. Help your children by ensuring that they wear their backpacks correctly, with both straps over the shoulders, and that they are only carrying what they need. If you have concerns about the load your child is carrying, reach out to a teacher or school staff to discuss what should and should not be coming home every day. 


