

A greeting of peace was not the first thing the disciples expected to hear from Jesus. "Where were you when I needed you?" "Why did you all run away?" "I'm disappointed in you." Those were the sort of things the disciples might have expected to hear. Instead, Jesus came in love. He wished them peace. He knew they were afraid and ashamed. But he proved that his death was all about forgiveness, even of their sins. It is the same for us. No matter what we have done, no matter how terrible we may think it is, Jesus comes to us with forgiveness, peace, and great love.

Gospel Recap: "Thomas is looking for You"

Gandhi, the great Hindu peacemaker, was once asked why he had rejected Christianity. Gandhi said he never rejected Jesus, but he just couldn't find many Christians that actually acted like Jesus. What would Gandhi say if he visited your family, your church, or your school campus? This week's Gospel points out a really important reality about Jesus' Resurrection. People will often need proof, in order to really believe in it. Thomas was like you or me. He found the other disciples' story hard to believe until Jesus appeared and personally showed him his wounds. This Easter season, ask yourself whether a doubting Thomas could see the resurrected Jesus in your life. Could someone come to be a believer in Christ by watching how you treat family, friends, and classmates? Would someone praise God because of how you look out for the poor? Would someone believe the Gospel's message because of seeing the way you take risks to do the right thing? If Gandhi followed you for a week, what would he say?




This Week's Faith Sharing Starters


