Pastoral Plan 2022-2023

How This Pastoral Plan Came to Be

The 2019-2020 Pastoral Planning Committee commissioned a comprehensive parish survey to reference in developing our parish's 5-year Pastoral Plan (which comprises 5-year goals for the period 2019 through 2024 and annual objectives). The committee expected that a comprehensive survey would provide an accurate assessment of our parishioners' views and contribute to determining the best ways to meet the needs of our faith community.

The Pastoral Planning Committee worked with CARA, the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate, a national, non-profit, Georgetown University affiliated research center that conducts social scientific studies about the Catholic Church. The committee studied and selected from CARA's bank of more than 700 questions before settling on 102 that could best characterize our parish. The spring 2019 in-pew survey participation rate was remarkable: 1260 parishioners responded. Our CARA survey results are available at <https://sjf.org/about/pastoral-council/>.

Through careful review of the survey results and heartfelt discernment, the Pastoral Planning Committee devised a set of 5-year goals and then, following from these goals, 2019-2020 objectives to address the needs of our parish. For the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 terms, the committee considered the needs of the parish in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic lockdown and emergence, while continuing to reference the CARA survey responses.

This year's Pastoral Planning Committee developed 2022-2023 objectives within the context of the extant 5-year goals listed in the center pages of this brochure. The committee also sought to reflect in the objectives the challenge of enhancing our parish life while coexisting with COVID-19. In our objectives, we focus on welcome and community, with a special emphasis on our youth, Please see page 4 for the 2022-2023 objectives. We earnestly ask for your prayers and active support.

Please recognize that this brochure is a call to action for all parishioners. For the Saint John Fisher Catholic community to move forward on our faith journey, we need to work together. Please give prayer and discernment to ways you can best contribute to our achieving these goals and objectives, then consider either joining a ministry or creating a ministry with others who share your passion.
