

#### **Lilies Needed for Easter**

The Easter Vigil Mass is offered for the intentions of all who donate Easter lilies to decorate our church. Please bring a lily to the church narthex and fill out a card to designate your prayer intention Cards are in a basket on top of the cabinet.



#### Lenten Penance Service - Wednesday, April 5

It will take place at 7:30 pm in the Church. This is an opportunity to experience the unconditional love of God through the sacrament of reconciliation. Many priests will be present to hear confessions and offer you the absolution of the Church.

#### **Eucharistic Adoration on Holy Thursday**

Eucharistic Adoration will take place on Holy Thursday in the Parish Activity Center after the Evening Service until midnight. The Blessed Sacrament will not be present in the Chapel of the Blessed Sacrament on Good Friday or Holy Saturday.



#### **Fast and Abstinence on Good Friday**

Good Friday is a day of fasting and abstinence. All Catholics over 14 years of age are to abstain from meat on that day, and anyone between 18 and 60 years of age is to fast. The secondary meals combined are to be less in quantity than the primary meal.

#### 310-377-5571 Good Friday Collection

Pope Francis asks our parish to support the Pontifical Good Friday Collection, which helps Christians in the Holy Land. This collection also helps to preserve the sacred shrines. The pandemic hit particularly hard for the Christians in the Holy Land. Most of them depend on pilgrimages to work. In these times of crisis, the collection is also necessary to meet the basic needs of the people of God still living in this land where the Church was born. 

#### Gospel Recap: "Begin to Face Your Tough Choices"

Think of what Jesus was dealing with on the first Palm Sunday over 2000 years ago as he sat on the Mount of Olives, looking across the valley at Jerusalem. He must have known that although so many people would cheer him and treat him like a rock star waving palms at him, just days later the authorities would come and arrest him. He must have known that death awaited him across that valley. And yet, he also must have known that he couldn't live with integrity without proclaiming his message in Jerusalem, the home of the religious and political leaders who had corrupted God's message of hope and peace. Regardless, this Gospel tells us that Jesus decided to cross that valley and to enter Jerusalem. And we all know the rest of the story. How about you? What decisions must you face that call for sacrifice and courage? Do you have friends whose destructive behavior you should challenge? Are there other kids at school, who need you to protect and stick up for them? Are there broken relationships in your life that you need to repair? Holy Week is a good time to face those decisions. Spend time with Jesus on Holy Thursday at his beautiful Last Supper, and then after when he's taken as a prisoner in the garden. Be with him on Good Friday when he courageously suffers and dies in the most tortuous way. And keep watch from Holy Saturday until Easter Sunday where his Resurrection provides the proof that death, violence, and fear have no ultimate power. Pray hard about your decisions as you watch Jesus make his. You'll find him walking beside you, offering the courage and wisdom you need.



Everyone grieves differently; for some it is a private process, others have a network of family and friends, but many people benefit from participating in a group. 


