There are 2 Classes for Year 1 in March on back-to-back weekends

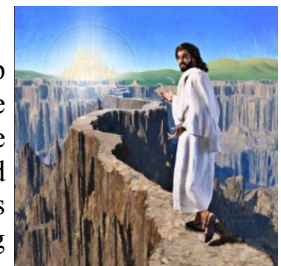

Gospel Recap: "Jesus Saves; But We Condemn"

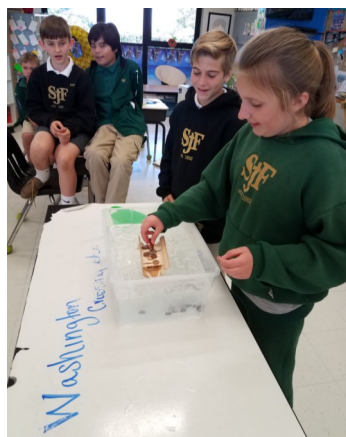
Sometimes we think God is busy watching for opportunities to condemn us. But Jesus clears up all that in today's Gospel. God doesn't look for opportunities to condemn us, but he wants to save us from lives without meaning and to prepare us for eternal life. We condemn ourselves if we ignore Jesus' plan for living. Through sin and selfishness we can build our own prison. But God wants to free us, so he sent Jesus to show us the way. God's only desire for us is to live our lives toward eternity with him. And if we selfishly spend the rest of our lives looking in all the wrong places, God will never withdraw the offer of our salvation.





Learning about American History in 5th Grade

Fifth grade social studies curriculum is all about American history and how our country was created! Recently 5th grade students were given a STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) challenge to create Durham boats. The purpose of this activity was to reinforce what they'd learned about George Washington crossing the Delaware. Students used various sized craft sticks, tape, poster board, and hot glue to recreate the wooden, flat-bottomed boats. Then they were able to launch the boat in the icy "Delaware" and see many how solders (pennies) plus George Washington (a quarter) it could accommodate. The challenge was met with excitement, creativity, and collaboration. Catherine T remarked, "It was a fun way of learning the designs of Durham boats and how they worked." Chloe G agreed, "Getting the boat across the Delaware was really hard, it must have been even harder for George Washington!" Hands-on activities help reinforce concepts, allow students to work together, and build classroom community.
