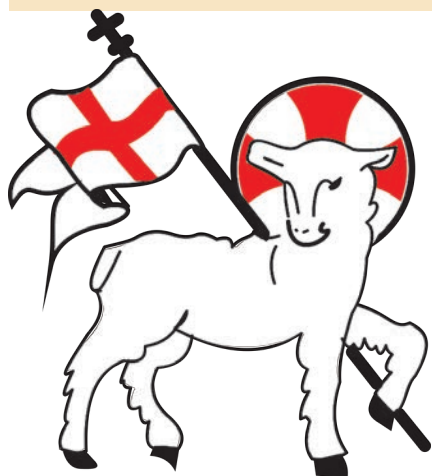

Focusing the Gospel

In John’s Gospel, John the Baptist appears not to baptize Jesus but to testify to the presence of Jesus. Baptism, a foundational sacrament of water, has numerous meanings in the New Testament and also for us today. When we dip our fingers into the holy water at church, we are reminded that we have been baptized into Christ’s death, with the forgiveness of sins. Then we, as his followers, are to testify to him in the world. Our belief in Jesus as the Son of God gives life in his name. We live this life having undergone the paschal mystery in our baptism from death to new life. (Living Liturgy, 2020).
