

In 2005, our parish created a Master Plan to meet the needs of a parish of the 21st century. In 2013, we fulfilled most of that plan through a new completing the v






### **Home is Holy: Resisting Temptation**



### Did You Know? Personalize your fire safety plan

Research shows that having a fire escape plan, and executing it quickly, greatly increases the chances of a successful escape from a house fire. In studies, researchers tested standard high-decibel smoke alarms on sleeping children, and found that just over half the children woke up to the noise. However, when researchers used personalized messages recorded by the children's parents in conjunction with the beeping smoke alarms, almost 100 percent of the children woke up and successfully followed their escape plan. 
### **Growing in the Word: Book of Revelation**

### Passover Seder at St. John Fisher, April 7

Passover is a significant religious holiday in the Jewish faith tradition. In the Book of Exodus we learn how God instructed Moses to save his chosen people from slavery in Egypt. During this salvation event many miracles take place as the Jews escape into the wilderness and begin their forty year journey to the Promised Land. In order to never forget God's salvation of his chosen people, Jews are commanded to have a yearly special family meal filled with ritual to remind them of the significance of the holiday. This meal is called a Seder. St. John Fisher will be hosting a Community Seder facilitated by Bob Rothman from Congregation Ner Tamid on April 7. Seating is limited to 200 participants.
