

A message from Monsignor Sork regarding the Coronavirus

I deeply regret that we are forced to suspend temporarily public celebration of the Mass at St John Fisher and in all parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Los Angeles. Although many of our activities here have been suspended, we will do what we can to provide spiritual comfort and support during these challenging times. All three of your priests will be concelebrating a private Mass daily in Church as we pray for you. They will take place Monday through Saturday at 8 am and 9 am on Sunday. These will be live-streamed, so that you can view it from home. You may access it through the parish web site, www.sif.org. The office will remain open to respond to your pastoral needs. I and brother priests will be available for individual appointments while we maintain the necessary social distance of 6 feet. Confessions will be available on the usual schedule. I ask your continued prayers for all those who are afflicted with this virus and those who are afraid and vulnerable. You might use the prayer in the back of the bulletin. I also ask you to pray and reach out to help the many families who are facing difficulties as a result of this emergency. We also need to keep in our prayers all the doctors, nurses, caregivers, and public health and civil authorities working to contain the outbreak of this virus and treat those who are sick.





Did You Know? Early abuse identification is key


We can do our best to ensure that the children in our community are as safe as possible, and one critical way is to take immediate action at the first hint of improper behavior by an adult towards a child. Be familiar with ways in which perpetrators attempt to groom children, their parents, and church communities so that you can recognize and interrupt such behaviors promptly. Paying attention to changes in behavior, appetite, or demeanor in the children we know is also important as these cues may be reflective of a child's distress. 

Stewardship Reflection

"Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the Lord looks into the heart." I Samuel 16:7 How often do we invest our time, talent and treasure in creating an appearance that does not matter at all to God? We strive to impress with our clothing, home, career, possessions, car and other marks of distinction. But none of these illusions of greatness will impress God. Instead, He will look into our hearts to see how much we loved Him, how much we loved others and how we showed that love by the way we used our time, talent, and treasure here on earth.

Living the Paschal Mystery

Giving up habits and ways of thinking can be difficult. Imagine making a change to something simple, such as a banking account with direct deposit and automatic bill-pay. Once a structure has been established, linking accounts, deposits, and debits, it can be cumbersome to make a change, close the account and open a new one. If we encounter such difficulty with a matter as simple as a bank account, imagine what we encounter when we change a way of thinking about something as central as religion, meaning, and purpose.



A Coronavirus Prayer

Jesus Christ, you traveled through towns and villages "curing every disease and illness." At your command, the sick were made well. Come to our aid now, in the midst of the global spread of the coronavirus, that we may experience your healing love.

Heal those who are sick with the virus. May they regain their strength and health through quality medical care.
