
Even though our church is open, the parish and school offices

Not everyone feels able to return to Mass, but remember that Jesus is still alive within you, even if you do not receive Communion. Jesus said "Whoever eats my

flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in him." He remains in us, even when we are deprived of Communion for months. Jesus promised he would stay with us forever. On this feast of the Body and Blood of Christ, we celebrate his presence in our lives at all times. Special congratulations to the children of the parish who will receive First Communion this month!

HIGH SCHOOL TEENS

Gospel Recap: "Christ is Really Here. Are You Present as Well?"

This Gospel can be hard for many of us to understand. The early Christians scared some of their contemporaries because they talked about eating someone's body and blood. Obviously that is not what we Christians do. But Christ is physically present in the forms of bread and wine, even though we can't physically observe it. Remembering a close friend who isn't physically present, (due to distance apart or due to death), can remind you that you are loved and cared for. Your friend's presence can still be very real at those times. How much more can Jesus Christ-who is truly present in the Eucharist--offer us comfort, strength, and move us to growth and challenge, when we eat and drink at the Eucharistic table? Here's something else to think about this week... Don't ask whether Christ is really present during the Mass. Think of it in another way... Are you really present at Mass? Let's say you call a friend on the phone for help or advice. You know that this person can really be there for you as a good listener and adviser. But if you don't pay attention or open your mind to this person, you're likely to miss the support your friend is offering. So focus on Mass in a different way: listen and respond to the prayers and the sacred Word, sing the songs. and greet the people near you. Lastly, as you receive the precious body of Christ, pray for strength and guidance to believe and see what is right in front of you.

Did you Know? Teach children everyday actions to reduce the spread of germs

It is appropriate to frequently remind your children about ways to avoid or reduce the spread of germs and to start practicing at home. Among the tips are: Stay away from people who are coughing, sneezing or sick. Remind them to cough or sneeze into a tissue or their elbow, then throw the tissue into the trash. Get the children into a handwashing habit. Teach them to wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after blowing their nose, coughing, or sneezing; going to the bathroom; and before eating or preparing food. If soap and water are not available, teach them to use hand sanitizer. Hand sanitizer should contain at least 60% alcohol. Supervise young children when they use hand sanitizer to prevent swallowing alcohol. Hearts to Serve



Stewardship Reflection

"Because there is one bread, we who are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread." I Corinthians 10:17 As disciples of Jesus, we are called to lead holy lives and invite others to join us. Living a stewardship lifestyle, being grateful and generous with our gifts, serves a twofold purpose. One, it helps build God's kingdom here on earth. Two, it helps us strengthen each other's relationship with God the Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit. It becomes our roadmap to Heaven. Let's help each other get there!

Connecting the Gospel

In the book of Deuteronomy, Moses reminds the people of how the Lord himself "fed you in the desert with manna." After letting the people be "afflicted with hunger" to help them understand that "not by bread alone does one live," God satisfies their hunger



with manna. This miraculous food sustained the people through their forty years in the desert before entering the Promised Land. Now, in the gospels, Jesus proclaims that he, the incarnate Son of God, is "the living bread that came down from heaven." Where are you hungering in your spiritual life and how might God be calling you to feed the hungry? (Living Liturgy, 2020)

Growing in the Word: Gospel of Matthew

The Gospel of Matthew is the first book of the New Testament, one which provides us with a unique faith portrait of Jesus. In this Gospel we learn important lessons on the formation of community and of Jesus as an authoritative teacher. This six week series is presented by Misty Jesse, PhD, DMin.
