

Home is Holy: Seeing is believing!

Have you heard the saying, "Seeing is believing?" It means that it is hard to believe something unless you see it for yourself. That's generally a good way to measure if something is *real*, but not necessarily if something is *true*. For instance, in today's Gospel, we read about Jesus walking on water. We can understand why his disciples have a hard time believing their eyes. Jesus invited Peter to try walking on water, and to Peter's surprise, it worked—as long as he kept his eyes on Jesus. To us, this seems unreal, But it reveals a truth that cannot be denied: Jesus is God, and with God all things are possible. Even if we can't understand how or why God does things, we can trust that he has our best interests in mind. God's plans for us are



always good; if we keep our eyes fixed on Jesus, we will eventually see God's plans revealed.

St. John Fisher Teachers Get Ready for Fall 2020



Despite the chaos of the pandemic and the uncertainty of school reopenings, the faculty and staff of St. John Fisher School are hard at work, preparing a rich, robust academic program and a safe environment for their students that will engage them and challenge them in distance learning and in-classroom instruction.

All the necessary steps are being taken to make the SJF campus in compliance with CDPH and CalOSHA guidelines to allow students to safely return to school as soon as possible. The school, in conjunction with the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and Department of Catholic Schools, has begun the CDPH waiver process to assist with a more immediate return to the classrooms.

In the meantime, teachers met this week to discuss and develop a solid plan for distance learning. Parent and student feedback from the spring was shared and taken into consideration while strategizing a strong start to the school year. Teachers brought their experience and expertise in technology applications to the discussion, while also bringing compassion and concern for students and their families. A balanced schedule of synchronous and asynchronous teaching was created, and student expectations were identified to allow for a consistent, productive remote learning experience at all grade levels TK-8. The greatest priority for the faculty was to outline a framework for success for the students, coupled with the necessary technological and emotional support to enable the highest level of student achievement possible. Teachers are energized and motivated to begin planning a successful year for their students in light of whatever teaching circumstances the pandemic throws their way.




