



# Gospel Recap: "It's Not the Persecution—It's Our Response"

Our entire history has been filled with pain and persecution of men killing or torturing their fellow men. But we can find hope in Jesus' Passion. It isn't meant to be all about his persecution and death. It needs to focus on Jesus' response to the people in his life. So think about this man who was the Son of God and also fully human. In Holy Week, despite his fear, uncertainty, loneliness, and agony, he focuses on God and on others. Through God's power, he offers the last hours of his life as a lesson to us to find meaning in every hour of our lives. Jesus' example of humility during the worst hours of his life still inspires others in our world who brave persecution and suffering to help their fellow men and women. Jesus' response on the road to Calvary showed tenderness to his mother, to Veronica, and to the weeping women who were devastated to lose their friend



and teacher. Jesus' response to the thief crucified next to him, who asked Jesus to remember him, was comforting and merciful. Even Jesus' response to those who were his executioners was a message of forgiveness and hope to us all.
