

The work is almost complete, and the courtyard will be ready for the opening of the 2017-18 school year on August 28.


Leviticus

A four week series on the Book of Leviticus, the third book of the Hebrew Bible, offered on Monday evenings 7 pm to 8:30 pm in the SJF Auditorium. This four week series will study the beginnings of the Levite priesthood, including the development and practice of liturgy. The class will offer opportunities to explore the impact Jewish practices had on Jesus, the disciples and the primitive early church.

Registration is through the Office of Evangelization or the first evening of the series.

Thomas the Apostle

Named among the Twelve Apostles in all four Gospels, Thomas figured prominently in several stories in the Gospel of John. He said he was ready to die with Jesus, that he didn't know where Jesus was going and so couldn't follow, and famously doubted a post-Resurrection appearance until he himself saw the risen Lord. For this, history has called him "doubting Thomas," but his name remains among the most popular Christian names. Four apocryphal writings were attributed to Thomas, and in church tradition, he evangelized in Syria, Persia (Iran), and India. Indian Catholics believe he was martyred and buried there. Thomas is the patron saint of India, builders, and the blind.
