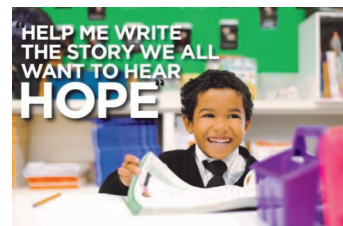

Home is Holy: Blessed are you!

The Gospel message today is a tough one. Jesus tells us that the poor, hungry, and the weeping are blessed. These are not usually the things we want to achieve in life. In fact, we typically seek out just the opposite. We strive for wealth, being well-fed, and enjoying happiness. When Jesus says “Blessed are you when people hate you”... is Jesus going too far? Yet that is the kind of life that he lived. He was poor, sometimes hungry, sometimes sad, and even hated by some people. Jesus doesn’t want us to have to suffer, but he knows that humans do at times. When we are poor, hungry, weeping, or hated, he wants us to remember that he is with us. It is not fun to feel any of these things, but these experiences can remind us to rely on him. Children at the 9 am Mass today will receive a sticker book about the Beatitudes, to help them live as Jesus calls us to live.

Favorites?"

Jesus always favored or blessed people without power by giving them his quality time. He would hang out with them, eat with them, and would even challenge old customs that caused some people to suffer. We need to follow Jesus’ cue and give those who are suffering in our midst a higher priority in our lives. We can show God’s favor to those who mourn by comforting them. We can show God’s favor to those who are powerless by serving them and working for justice. Yes, God loves everyone equally, but the scriptures show us that God’s actions tended to favor the powerless and those on the margins of society who were really suffering. In modeling Jesus putting the forgotten first, we can show those who abuse or hoard power and hurt others, that it’s now time to change.



St. John Fisher Parish School Science Fair

The St. John Fisher Parish School Science Fair was held in Barrett Hall on February 5th-7th. The Science Fair is a wonderful opportunity for students to choose a topic of interest, conduct research, perform an experiment, collect data, and draw conclusions. Projects included topics such as: the effects of food allergies, engineering a new backpack prototype, the most effective pool covers, the best brand of popcorn, the effects of microwave radiation on plant seeds, and the study of change blindness.

Thirteen SJF students have been selected to attend the 69th Annual Los Angeles County Science and Engineering Fair in March. Here, students will present their projects to judges, articulating their findings and explaining their research. We have had tremendous results in past years, not only having multiple students place at the County level, but continue on to the California State Science fair, where our students have also received numerous awards.

Today’s Gospel Focus

Jesus begins his famous Sermon on the Plain in Luke by turning the world on its head. In the kingdom of God the blessed are those who are marginalized and oppressed in our societies. Those who enjoy favor now will not find it in God’s kingdom. Today Jesus gives us a choice. Do we glory in the richness of the kingdom of God or in what our world counts as riches?

Stewardship Reflection

“Blessed are you when people hate you, ...exclude and insult you, and denounce your name...on account of the Son of Man.” Luke 6:22

All of us have been in situations when someone has made a negative comment or joke about God or our Catholic faith. How did you respond? Did you stay silent or pretend to go along with the crowd because you didn’t want to cause waves and then, later, you felt bad? Know that God is with you all the time; the Holy Spirit will put the right words in your mouth. Pray for the strength and courage to proclaim our faith to others, especially during uncomfortable situations.

Cecilia, Third Century

Cecilia has been honored as a martyr since about 545. According to a written legend, the Passion of St. Cecilia, she was a Roman Christian of the patrician class betrothed to the pagan Valerian. The Cecilia Passion has her singing to God in her heart on her wedding day. Cecilia tells Valerian she has made a vow of virginity and persuades him to convert to Christianity and enter into a celibate marriage. His brother, Tiburtius, also becomes a Christian. The brothers are later martyred. When Cecilia refuses to perform an idolatrous act, she too is martyred. Cecilia is the patron of musicians.
