


Parish Giving Tree Starts in 2 Weeks

Family Promise of the South Bay at St. John Fisher—Jan. 5-12, 2020

St. John Fisher will be hosting several homeless families on campus the week of Jan. 5-12. The families are participants in Family Promise of the South Bay. This program successfully helps local newly homeless families transition into permanent housing. The program is supported by thirteen faith communities in the South Bay. Throughout the year each faith community provides three to four weeks of shelter and food for these families. At St. John Fisher our ministry coordinators for this program are Dave and Yolanda Williams. We are always in need of volunteers to assist during the week the families are on site. Volunteers can help with meals, set up and take down of the housing facilities and in particular we need overnight chaperones (lodging is provided separately from the families). 
