## Home is Holy: Helping each other do the right thing

When we discover people are doing something wrong, how do we respond? Do we go to them and try to help them improve? Do we talk about them behind their backs? Do we just ignore what they are doing and let them get into deeper trouble? In our Gospel today, Jesus shows us that we have a responsibility to help each other improve. That's hard to do because our good intentions might be seen as butting in when it's not our business. But Jesus reminds us that he will be with us and wants us to care enough to make a difference in other people's lives. If we ask for his help, he will give us the right words to use. We must always speak the truth in love.

## **Gospel Recap: Loosen Those Bonds**

Too many people sit in pain and anger after an argument--or after they hear that someone has publicly dissed them. That same pain and anger bind us. These emotions eat up our energy, and keep us from focusing on school or work, which makes us toss and turn at night. In this week's Gospel, Jesus offers a recipe for freedom from these negative emotions. He tells us to confront the person who hurt us. The early Christians sinned against one another in a variety of ways. Matthew included this teaching from Jesus, possibly as advice for them. First, talk about your conflict one on one. If that doesn't help, find an objective person who might help you work things out. If that still doesn't work, you might have to end the relationship. We can all use this advice too. When people hurt you, face them and express your feelings without attacking or insulting them. Sometimes people don't know they've done something hurtful until you confront them. Unfortunately, there are others who just can't ever admit that they are wrong. Rather than continue to let them hurt you, move on to other friendships or healthier relationships. You deserve better.


