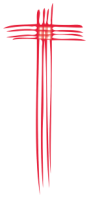

Did You Know? Teach your children the concept of “total body safety”

Teaching the concept of “total body safety” encompasses all parts of the body, including the head, mouth, legs and arms, which are usually overlooked. Child abuse perpetrators can use any part of the body to stimulate a child or young person, or to arouse themselves. Additionally, it is important to stress to teens the importance of “total body safety” in their relationships with others. Growing in the Word: Joshua-Judges

Join us for this eight week series as we explore the world of the Old Testament through the ancient lens of Joshua and Judges. In Genesis, God promised Abraham many descendants and the making of a great nation. In Joshua the promises are brought to fulfillment. The book of Judges follows Joshua and covers a period of approximate 150 years.
