Msgr. Sork opened the meeting at 7:02 pm. Msgr. Sork welcomed the staff representative and guests.

Pastor-Parish Life (Msgr. Sork)

Year of Mercv

Msgr. Sork reminded everyone about the discussion at the last Pastoral Council meeting to create one committee to focus on the festivities of his vision for the Year of Mercy. The committee members are Hanan Tanios, Misty Jesse, Beverly Beatty, Grant Hungerford, Bill Mundy and Chris Ratliff. Chris handed out the briefs from the first committee meeting. A tower banner has been ordered for the outside of the church to "announce" the Year of Mercy to the community. It is a vertical banner (7 feet x 36 feet) and will face the street. It should arrive by Ash Wednesday. Five themed banners for the Narthex have also been ordered. These will be changed at approximately twomonth intervals. There is a Year of Mercy article in the Worship section of the bulletin every weekend. There will be an advertisement in the PV News. Pastoral Staff recommends not displacing the Easter Mass advertisement. Pastoral Staff would like to hold off on the pew cards as there are already many items in the pews. The committee is still working on a way to collect and display these cards in the Narthex. They are researching a phone app for the Year of Mercy and looking at street banners similar to the ones on the corner of Hawthorne and Highridge. The committee contacted American Martyrs and St. Anthony's to discuss weekend small group pilgrimages throughout the year to various churches to pray the rosary or meditate on the Stations of the Cross. St. Maria Goretti website will announce a relic tour in the Western United States. The committee will monitor the web site to find out when it's coming to town.

Upcoming Lent Activities

 Shrove Tuesday Luncheon - Women's Council is selling tickets for the luncheon on February 9. Msgr. Kevin Kostelnik is the speaker. St. John Fisher was his first assignment as a priest over 30 years ago. He is currently Pastor at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels.

- School Accreditation and Fundraiser Anne Marie informed the Council that a team from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) will be at SJF February 16 18 to review the school for their accreditation. This happens every six years. The school must present a 60-page document about the school and its development over the past six years. The team will interview parents and teachers and have dinner with the school board.
 - The fundraiser takes place on February 20th at Trump National Golf Club. It's a dinner and dance with live and silent auctions from 6:00 PM 11:00 PM.
- Ash Wednesday is February 10. SJF has services at 6:30 AM (Mass), 8:00 AM (Mass), 11:00 AM (School Mass), 4:00 PM (Liturgy), 5:15 PM (Mass) and 7:30 PM (Liturgy). There will be a 6:30 AM Mass every weekday morning throughout the season of Lent.
- Lenten Soup Suppers take place every Friday during Lent from February 12 –
 March 18 after the 5:15 PM Mass. There is no soup supper on Good Friday.
- Stations of the Cross Following the soup supper on first Friday of Lent,
 February 12, there will be a special presentation of the Passion of the Lord with
 the Music Ministry followed by the Stations of the Cross. The rest of the Fridays
 will be the regular Stations of the Cross.
- Living Stations of the Cross presented by the Youth Ministry will take place on Friday, March 18 at 7:00 PM and Palm Sunday, March 20 at 3:00 PM.
- The Parish Mission begins on Palm Sunday, March 20. Jon Leonetti is the Mission speaker this year. SJF gave away his book Your God is Too Boring at Easter last year. He will speak at each of the Masses on March 19 and 20. His presentation is in Barrett Hall on the following dates:

Jon Leonetti suggested that SJF write a few paragraphs to mail to all the households inviting them to the event. Nelma FitzGerald created a beautiful postcard and flyer with all the information about the Mission event. Misty wants to know what Pastoral Council thinks of the idea. A discussion ensued about the best way to disseminate the information to the parish. Some of the suggestions included: insert them in Msgr. Sork's letter to the parish, put them in the pews, have staff members send them electronically through School Speak, hand them out after Mass, insert them in the bulletin, put them in the Easter mailing, and/or put it on the web site. It was decided that it would be too costly to write a letter and mail it to the 3,000 plus families in the parish. The back of the March 6 bulletin will have the flyer with all the information.

The Easter Triduum will be discussed at the March Pastoral Council meeting.

Msgr. Sork gave an update on the organ. It looks like we will be able to sign a contract this month. We are about \$200,000 short in cash received and about \$70,000 in pledges. The original estimate of \$800,000 did not take into account the sales tax. So there are still more people to reach out to for the pledges. SJF must show the Archdiocese that we have the pledges and are not taking out a loan. If the contract is not signed by February 15, the organ company can increase the price. Msgr. Sork sent a letter to the Bishop, and the Archdiocese is reviewing the contract now. If all goes well, there could be a new organ in the church by Christmas 2016. Msgr. Sork said Grant worked very hard to make this happen, so big kudos to him.

Approval of January Minutes

Pastoral Council Nominating Committee

This would eliminate the information session on March 30. Gayle and Jeanne will work together to revise the dates for the pulpit and bulletin announcements. The application deadline is the middle of April.
