Msgr. Sork opened the meeting at 7:01 pm. Msgr. Sork welcomed the staff representative and guests.

## Pastor-Parish Life (Msgr. Sork)

#### Year of Mercy

We are in the Jubilee Year of Mercy. Msgr. Sork asked for feedback on the banner in the Narthex and the one on the outside of the church. Gayle Plecha said the City of Rancho Palos Verdes received a complaint about the banner on the outside of the church. SJF should have applied for a special use permit to display a banner larger than 4 by 8 feet. Our banner is 7 by 36 feet. She has now submitted the paperwork for the permit to display the banner through November 2016, and the City sent notices to all the neighbors within a 500-foot radius of the church. The banner has been vandalized almost every day for the last two weeks. It was suggested that a security camera be installed to deter any further vandalism. On a positive note, more people seem to be coming back to the church. People really like the banner in the Narthex. Keith Kamholz would like to use one of the Narthex banners at the PV Street Fair.

Hanan Tanios reported that the pilgrimage to St. Anthony's Church in Long Beach was not well attended. There were many things happening that weekend that may have conflicted with it. The Holy Year Committee said if there is no interest from the parishioners, they will not continue to organize them. Maybe it would be better to organize something after Lent. Msgr. Sork read a letter from Bishop Solis to the members of Deanery 19 inviting them to American Martyrs for 24 hours of prayer on March 4/5.

Hanan asked for suggestions for distributing the Works of Mercy cards to parishioners during Easter. It was decided that the cantor will make an announcement about the cards and then baskets with the cards will be passed around toward the end of Mass, and each parishioner will take a card. Msgr. Sork would like parishioners to keep these cards. It was suggested to challenge people to perform some of the Works of Mercy or announce an upcoming project for them to get involved in. The Committee would like to have a box in the Narthex for people to put a different card in as they accomplish these Works of Mercy. Gayle asked the Committee to draft a very brief announcement to

send to Msgr. Sork. He will try to incorporate it and possibly ask the priests to add it to their homily.

# **Evaluation of First 2 Weeks of Lenten Activities**

The first three Soup Suppers went well. The numbers are up from last year, although R.E. Congress may have an effect on the turnout last Friday when the Knights of Columbus hosted it. On the First Friday of Lent the choir sang the Passion before the Stations of the Cross. There was a good turnout.

His evening talks are March 20, 21, and 22 with supper at 6:00 PM and the presentation at 7:00 PM. The presentations are repeated the following mornings, March 21, 22, and 23 at 9:00 AM.
