- Teen Speaker/Musician Joe Melendrez March 10
 - There was a positive response to Joe Melendrez. Dana Hargrave loved his message, and he had so much energy. She felt making it mandatory for confirmation students and parents was a great idea. This is the kind of event that we're trying to bring into the parish. Joe Arroyo thought his treatment of the Holy Spirit was really great. Megan Tilles appreciated all the support from Parish Council at the event. She felt making the event mandatory for confirmation students and a parent made things difficult, and it changed the attitude towards the event. Msgr. Sork said if you don't make it mandatory, then people don't go. Due to the large size of the confirmation class, this event was done in lieu of the Living Stations. Megan Tilles requested having the evaluation cards at events like this.
- Dive-in Lenten Series March 11-21

Msgr. Sork asked for feedback from those who attended the presentations at other locations than SJF. He said the sound system at St. Lawrence makes it difficult to hear the speakers. Bill Smith felt Daniel Smith-Christopher, Misty Jesse and Fr. Alexei Smith were very good. Msgr. Sork thought Misty Jesse was disappointed with Christopher Kaczor. Msgr. Approval of March Minutes

Beverly Beatty asked for corrections to March minutes. Hearing none, Dana Hargrave moved to approve the March minutes as presented. Megan Tilles seconded. The minutes were approved.

Update on CARA Survey for New 5-Year Goals for the Pastoral Plan

Dave Williams said CARA received the surveys a week ago. The turnaround time is 10-12 weeks. Apparently everyone wants their surveys completed by May. Msgr. Sork commended Dave Williams for coming up with this type of survey. The survey was for anyone 16 years and older. 1,260 surveys were submitted. Msgr. Sork said it is a significant number of responses. Some sections were left blank perhaps because they seemed too daunting. Megan Tilles said it was very organized and worked like clockwork. Chris Ratliff did a great job leading it. Having music during the survey made a difference.

Lenten Soup Supper – March 22

Beverly Beatty thanked those council members who helped with the soup supper. Beverly Beatty said they are discussing finding a new soup recipe. It was a good turnout even with R.E. Congress that night.

New Parishioners Brunch – June 2 – Plaza Room

The brunch will begin after the 10:45 AM Mass. And rea Fowler sent Beverly Beatty a list of the 79 new parishioners, so postcard invitations can now be mailed. Margaret Johnson will assist with the invitations. Frank Lee has again volunteered to call each person to personally invite them. Please sign up to be on the committee and bring food. PV Street Fair – June 8-9

Carl Mossberg sent application to the City, and it was accepted. Hopefully they can borrow Keith Kamholz' tent again this year. It costs \$320 to rent one from the City. Volunteers are needed to staff the booth. Msgr. Sork asked what was being promoted this year. Carl Mossberg said no theme has been decided yet. He and Bill Munday were thinking about Christ: the reason for spirituality. Beverly Beatty suggested promoting a variety of activities that the church does. Msgr. Sork suggested making it a topic for a future meeting. The school helped to staff the booth last year because they were promoting the new transitional Kindergarten. Two years ago they promoted the music at SJF.

<u>Other</u>

- Kelly Tramontin suggested looking at the parking situation with the hikers as an opportunity instead of something to prevent. These hikers could be looking for a church community. SJF wants to be a welcoming parish, so instead of threatening to have their cars towed, find a way to welcome them to the church. A concern was raised about who would do this.
- Beverly Beatty reported someone asked why SJF doesn't have a St. Patrick's Day party for seniors like St. Lawrence does. Carl Mossberg said the Mary and Joseph Retreat Center hosts one every year.
- Megan Tilles asked if the concert this Sunday had been advertised beyond the church. Beverly Beatty said that advertising is handled through Grant Hungerford and the music guild. Msgr. Sork said it was on the back of the bulletin and promoted outside the parish.

• Megan Tilles said the LGBT meetings at St. Lawrence are not being advertised in the bulletin anymore. She will call the parish office to make sure those are put back in the bulletin.

The meeting was concluded at 8:08 PM, and the Pastoral Council went into Executive Session.
