### Feedback on RE Congress

Msgr. Sork asked for feedback from those who attended RE Congress. The presenters at Youth Day were great. It's very inspiring and invigorating. Everyone should try it at least one day. It is a wonderful opportunity to see so many Catholics all in one place. The Masses were spectacular. SJF had a wonderful hospitality suite. The exhibit halls were amazing. Nearly every state in the union was represented along with several countries. This congress is the biggest of its kind in the world, and it's right in our own backyard.

## Feedback on Lenten Activities

Dive-In USS – Paul and Jeanne Leo attended the talk at St. Lawrence about gratitude. It was very good. Cardinal Mahony spoke at SJF about immigration. Dive-in needs to be better promoted since it is a good way for people to get enriched during Lent.

Soup Suppers – Pastoral Council hosted the soup supper on March 17<sup>th</sup>. They had a great time and decorated for St. Patrick's Day. About 40 people attended the supper and really seemed to enjoy themselves.

Stations of the Cross – No Pastoral Council members attended.

Living Stations of the Cross – No Pastoral Council members attended. Katie Dante reported that the Friday night performance was the biggest crowd they had ever seen. The Sunday night performance is usually less. There are always two performances because the kids work so hard at putting the production together. The parents were a big help. This year they had Jesus shrouded in a cloth and walk to the front of the church and then into the adoration chapel, which is where the living Jesus is. Many people seemed to get the symbolism.

Parish Mission – Mike Patin was an excellent choice for a speaker. He grabbed everyone's attention from beginning to end. He was funny, entertaining and engaging. Some of the youth really seemed to listen to him. He is a dynamic person, and it was a wonderful event. Katie Dante asked all of the Year 1 Confirmation candidates to pick one of the nights to attend instead of having their regular class. Many of the candidates attended with their parents, and some even came back for a second night. The food was fabulous.

Lenten concert – Several Pastoral Council members attended the concert. It was beautiful – "like being in heaven." The organ really added to the concert, and the choir was wonderful. A few people in attendance complained that there was nothing mentioned about the choir in the bulletin article. Maybe more people would have attended if the choir had been mentioned. Gayle Plecha said that each department is responsible for submitting bulletin articles for their events, and that article was what the music department submitted. At the last meeting Pastoral Council had offered to provide hospitality at the reception after the concert; however, there was no reception.

#### **Holy Week and Easter Mass Schedule**

Good Friday services with proclamation of the Passion and Holy Communion are at 3:00 PM and 7:30 PM. New members of the church will be baptized at the Easter Vigil at 8:00 PM on Saturday. Fr. Kalu will do the washing of the feet on Holy Thursday and carrying of the candle at the Easter Vigil since Fr. Francis is recovering from knee surgery. Msgr. Sork asked Katie Dante to talk to Fr. Francis about finding people for the foot washing since this is his first Holy Thursday at St. John Fisher.

#### **60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration**

The 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Msgr. Gilb's ordination will be celebrated on May 7<sup>th</sup> after the 10:45 AM Mass. There will be sandwiches, salads, cakes, cookies, lemonade and coffee in Barrett Hall. Gayle Plecha asked for suggestions for a program. Suggestions included have those who were baptized, received their first Communion or were married by Msgr. Gilb speak at the reception; have the choir perform a song or tribute to him; share milestones that occurred while he was pastor; picture boards displayed in the hall; put an article in the bulletin asking parishioners to submit memories/stories. Pastoral Council will act as hosts and wear their badges. Volunteers are needed to put together a program and help with decorations. Bob Rapoza offered to put together a slideshow if people will send him pictures. Gayle will put him in touch with Kit Ruona, who may have access to photos. Women's Council also has photo albums from various years, and they have also been asked to assist with the event. In his most recent letter Msgr. Sork invited parishioners to attend, and he will find out who Msgr. Gilb would like to invite.

The PVP Chamber of Commerce is reorganizing the layout due to the construction at the mall, but should still put SJF's booth near where it was last year. Keith Kamholz will lend his canopy and agreed to help set it up. Bob Rapoza also volunteered to help with the set up, which begins at 6:30 AM. This year the focus will be on SJF School enrollment and transitional Kindergarten. Mac Chapman will talk with the school to get school parents to volunteer at the booth. The patriotic music concert on June 24<sup>th</sup> will also be promoted. Mac Chapman requested that PC members email him if they can help. Carl Mossberg volunteered to help.
