# 2019 – 2020 Pastoral Plan Objectives:

• Team Leaders' Briefs

- Objectives 1-5
- Objective 6 and 7; reporting complete

Objective #1 - We will identify and reach out to formerly active parishioners of all ages. Sheila Bloodgood reported that the group met on March 3. She passed around the first draft of the postcard. The first event is in early May. They want to finalize the postcard by the beginning of April and then mail it two weeks later. They still need Zack Zuvich's Life Teen input for the reverse side. They've decided to mail a postcard three times a year: April, September and December. Sheila Bloodgood made note of several corrections/changes to the postcard suggested by PC members, including that the colors should be more eye-catching.

Objective #2 - We will seek opportunities to witness at Mass in various ways to help make the Gospel come alive. Carl Mossberg said he is working with Fr. Francis to have a parishioner speak at a Mass in March. A parishioner presented a witness statement in December.

*Objective #3 - We will support the implementation of Life Teen.* Megan Tilles reported that she conferred with Zack Zuvich and learned that he might need help with food at an April event.

Chiby Onyeador is going to the meeting on Sunday. He is trying to get as many of his friends to attend and will report back. Roya Adli said about 15 to 20 teens came to the XLT in the church and they appeared to have appreciated it.

*Objective #4 - We will support ministries and provide opportunities for their continued success by <u>promoting</u> volunteerism. Dana Hargrave briefed.* 

- The group's consensus is that SJF has many active ministries and volunteers that are making a difference in the community.
- The group wants to challenge all parishioners to think about getting involved with one or more of the ministries. She feels that message should come from the pulpit. She suggested a town hall with the SJF leadership so they can get input directly. She feels there needs to be a surveying or monitoring of the ministries.
- She offered that SJF could do more to provide volunteer opportunities tailored to working families who have children. Sheila Bloodgood added that her family was in the Greeter Ministry when her kids were young, and it was a great way to expose them to a ministry.
- She stated that Habitat for Humanity, Family Promise of the South Bay, and Ushers are among the four that need support. Msgr. Sork added that there is a need for bereavement ministers. His letter to the parishioners will discuss that need. Grant Hungerford said that SJF could do a better job of making known to the parish which ministries need help. He believes something more focused is needed, in addition to the Fall Kickoff.
- She talked to Bill Munday about the Called & Gifted<sup>™</sup> Discernment Process (<u>https://siena.org/called-gifted</u>) because it aligns well with this goal. Gayle Plecha confirmed that Called & Gifted<sup>™</sup> was done at SJF about 10 years ago. There was a cost to it, but it was a great discernment tool. Chris Ratliff suggested Bill Munday put together a comprehensive proposal and submit it to Misty Jesse.

# *Objective #5 - We will improve our use of social media to better enable all our goals.* Megan Tilles briefed.

- She suggested creating a committee, a ministry, to work with Andrea Fowler to help with gathering input, especially photographs, and posting. High school and college students could be very good at social media.
- She had a conversation with Sherry Hayes Peirce (social media adviser at American Martyrs Catholic Church) who gave her a lot of good information. She attended Ms. Pierce's session titled "What Would Jesus Post" at R.E. Congress. She provided a handout with the five things every parish should post, which includes items the Pope and priests say, daily inspirational messages, things that happen behind the scenes, saints' days, and parish life.
- Sherry Hayes-Peirce would come to SJF for a \$100/hour to talk to everyone who is involved in social media including a school representative.
- Flocknote is a good tool for churches because it gives real-time messages to the parishioners.
- 3.8 million people use social media, so it's very important for the parish to move forward.
- Whoever is posting to Instagram should have information 30 days in advance. They should use unique backgrounds for bible messages and include social justice events and Food Pantry information, among other events.
- There needs to be pulpit announcements for special postings on Instagram and encourage people to follow SJF and share the information.

- She talked to Zack Zuvich about his Instagram page and sent him the information she got from the R.E. Congress.
- Chris Ratliff suggested the group create a 30-day plan for a committee to develop content for social media.
- Chiby Onyeador suggested creating a Drop Box for people to upload photos from events to be used on Instagram.

# April Meeting: March 31

Msgr. Sork will be attending the penance service at Holy Trinity on April 1<sup>st</sup>, so the Pastoral Council meeting has been moved to March 31. The chair reminded everyone to mark their calendars for the next meeting, which begins at 6:00 pm with the information session/meet and greet.

# <u>Other</u>

• Bill Smith said several parishioners have asked what the parish and diocese are doing to prevent coronavirus infection when handling the chalice during communion. Msgr. Sork said the Archdiocese sent out guidelines, and SJF will follow them and publish them in the bulletin and on the website. Among the guidelines are: do not come to Mass if you think you have something; we will not shake hands at the sign of peace; we will not hold hands during the recitation of the Our Father; and the Eucharistic Ministers use hand sanitizer. Msgr. Sork commented that receiving the blood from the cup is probably the safer of the two because you are more likely to transmit a disease from taking the host, especially on the tongue.

- Chris Ratliff commented that the Archdiocese guidelines align with the CDC guidelines.
- Joe Arroyo and Dana Hargrave suggested that something be put on the SJF website
